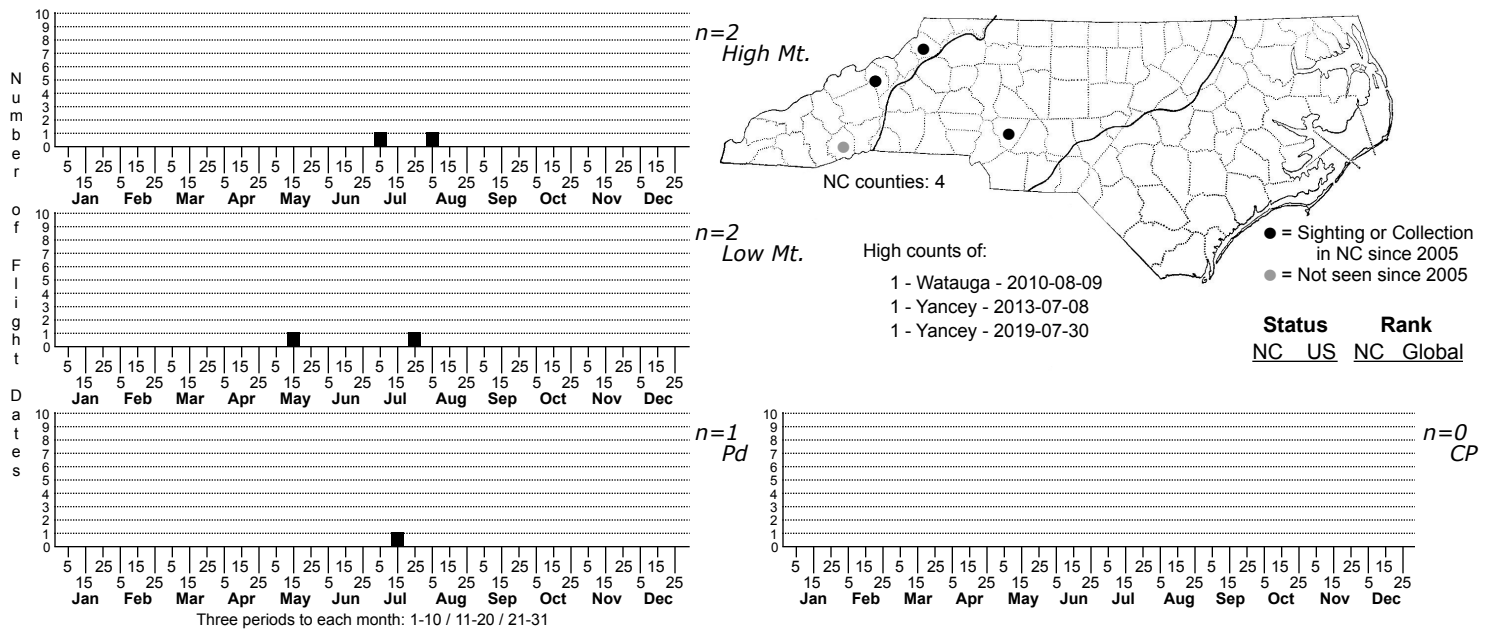


Apamea indocilis Ignorant *Apamea*



FAMILY: Noctuidae SUBFAMILY: Noctuinae TRIBE: Apameini

TAXONOMIC_COMMENTS: A Holarctic genus of about 140 species, with 63 recorded in North America, mostly from boreal or montane habitats (Mikkola et al., 2009). Seventeen species occur in North Carolina with the majority of records coming from the mountains.

HABITAT: Our records come mainly from the Mountains, including from some of our highest elevations. Habitats in that region include Spruce-fir Forests, Northern Hardwoods, and cove forests. One site in the Piedmont is adjacent to a tract of bottomland hardwoods.

FOOD: Larvae have been found on "coarse grasses and sedges," at least in the Pacific Coast region (Crumb, 1956; Mikkola et al., 2009). We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
