
Resapamea passer Dock Rustic Moth

HABITAT: Our records come mainly from fairly open habitats -- including semi-rural residential areas.

FOOD: Larvae feed on dock (<i>Rumex</i> spp.) (Rockburne & Lafontaine, 1976). The most widespread species of dock in North Carolina are introduced species. In the Mountains, the only recorded native species is Pale Dock (<i>Rumex altissimus</i>).
