




Globia oblonga Oblong Sedge Borer Moth

HABITAT: Our records come from marshy beaver and depression ponds, lakeshores, mountain bogs, and other open wetlands that support cattails.

FOOD: Larvae reportedly feed on cattails, including Broadleaf Cattail (<i>Typha latifolia</i>) and Narrowleaf Cattail (<i>T. angustifolia</i>) (Eiseman, 2022).
