

HABITAT: In the Fall-line Sandhills, our records come from beaver pond habitats where <i>Iris virginica</i> is the likely host. In the Piedmont and Mountains, records come from residential areas where the hosts are probably cultivated species.

FOOD: Larval feed on members of the iris family (Iridaceae), including <i>Iris</i> and <i>Gladiolus</i> (Wagner et al.,2001). Our only feeding record in North Carolina is for non-native Yellow Iris (<i>Iris pseudacorus</i>).
