
Papaipema inquaesita Sensitive Fern Borer Moth

HABITAT: Our records come mainly from wet habitats, including mountain bogs, wet meadows, and riparian habitats. One record comes from a ridge top adjoining an extensive mesic forest, but with a stream valley at the bottom of the slope.

FOOD: Larvae are borers in Sensitive Fern (<i>Onoclea sensibilis</i>) (Wagner et al.,2011).
