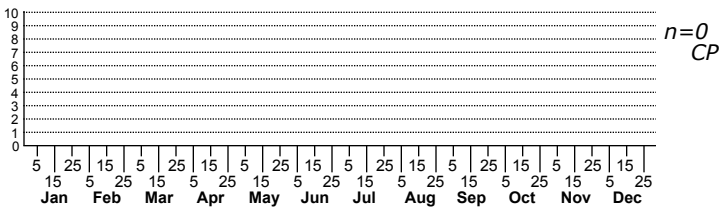
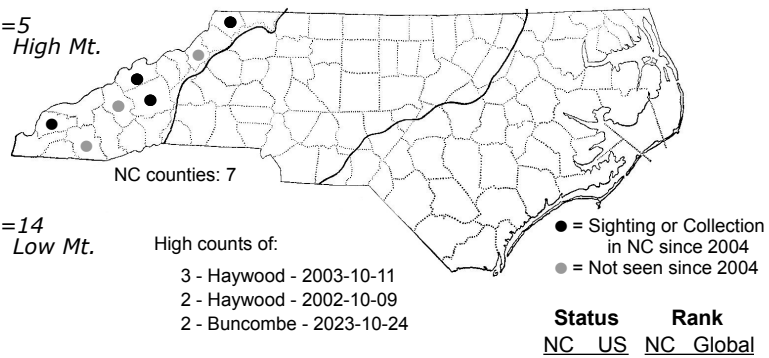
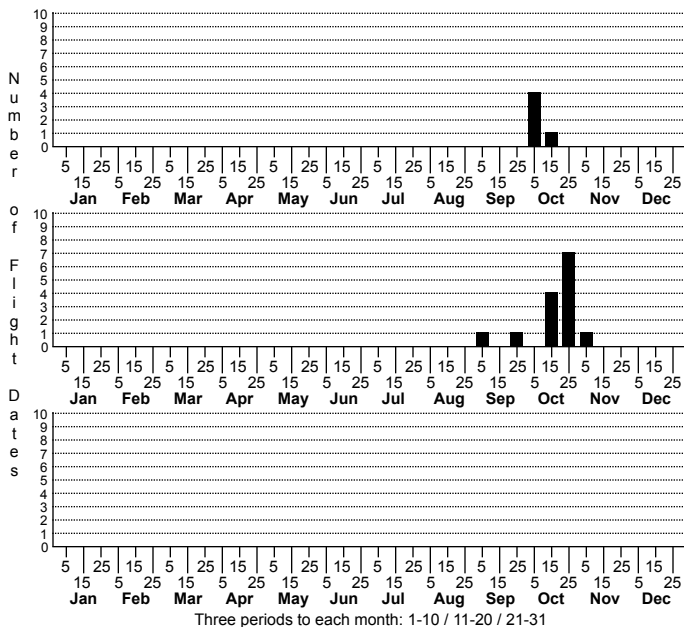


Papaipema eupatorii Eupatorium Borer
