
Papaipema rigida Rigid Sunflower Borer Moth

HABITAT: We have records from both montane wet meadows and high elevation fields. Several records also come from cove forests and high elevation hardwoods.

FOOD: Larvae feed on composites, particularly sunflower (<i>Helianthus</i>) species, including Jerusalem Artichoke (<i>H. tuberosus</i>) and Paleleaf Sunflower (<i>H. strumosus</i>) (Robinson et al., 2010). Other composites that are reportedly used include sneezeweed (<i>Helenium</i>), Smooth Oxeye (<i>Heliopsis helianthoides</i>), and Common Golden-Alexanders (<i>Zizia aurea</i>) (Covell, 1984; Wagner et al., 2011).
