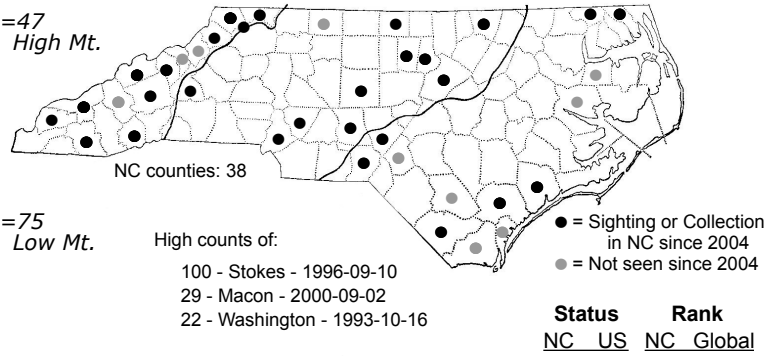
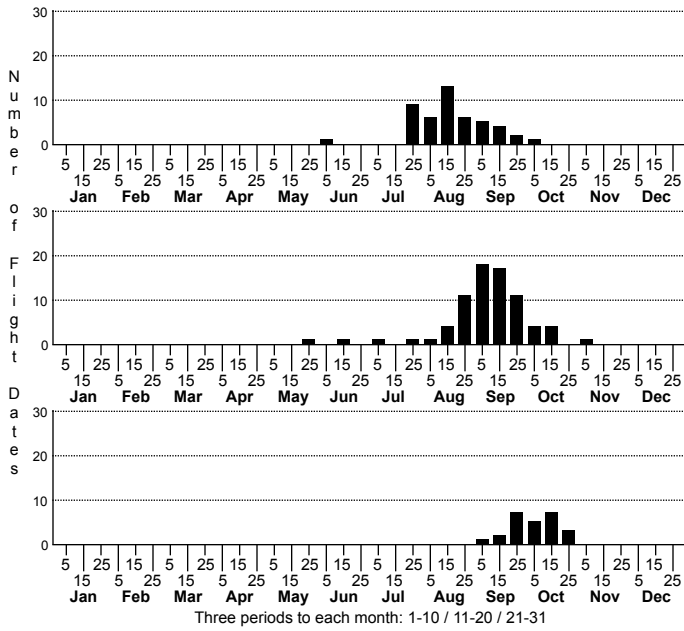
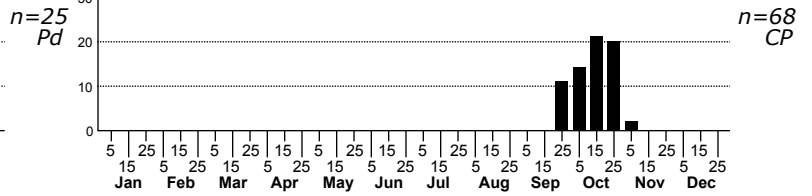


Phlogophora periculosa Brown Angle Shades Moth

HABITAT: Wagner et al. (2011) list woodlands and forests as habitats used by this species. Most of our records come from hardwood-dominated forests, but there are also a significant number from Longleaf Pine savannas, flatwoods, and sand ridges.

FOOD: Larvae are highly polyphagous, feeding on ferns, forbs, shrubs, hardwoods, and conifers (Wagner et al., 2011)
