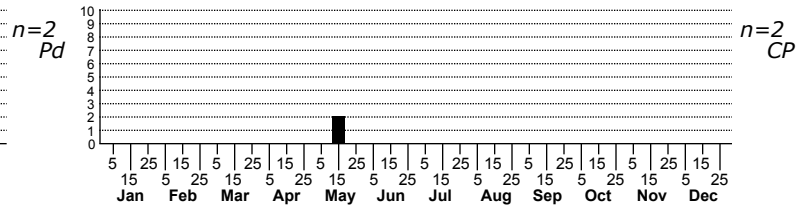
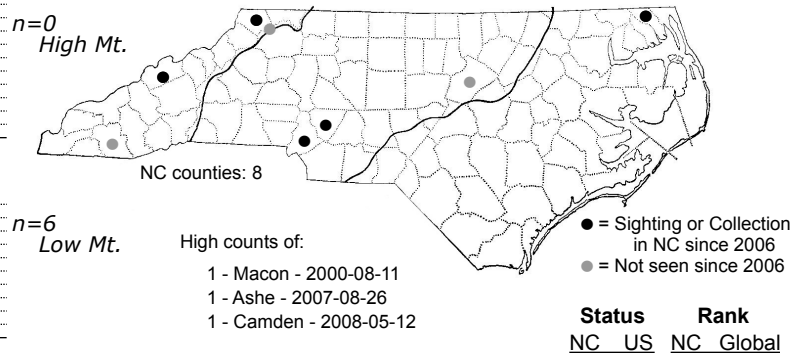
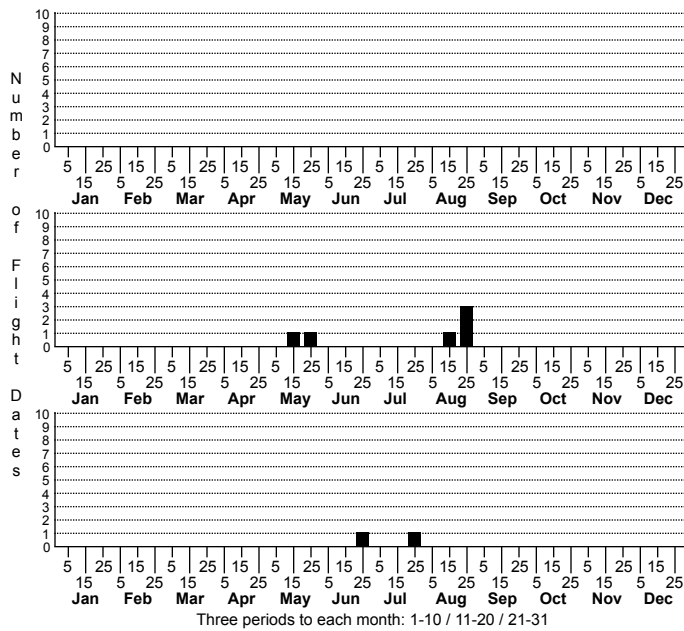


Dypterygia rozmani American Bird's-wing Moth

HABITAT: The use of Dock and Plantain suggest that ruderal or other early successional habitats could be used. However, our records come mainly from mesic-to-wet forests, which is more consistent with the use of Common Climbing Buckwheat.

FOOD: Larvae have been reported on dock (*Rumex* spp.), Common Climbing Buckwheat (*Fallopia scandens*), and plantain (*Plantago* spp.) (Robinson et al., 2010; Wagner et al., 2011).
