

HABITAT: Our two records for this species come from Spruce-fir Forests, where the species is more likely to be a rare stray rather than a resident.

FOOD: Larvae have recorded on Showy Milkwort (<i>Asemeia grandiflora</i>) (Robinson et al., 2010), which is rare in North Carolina and restricted to the Sandhills region. We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
