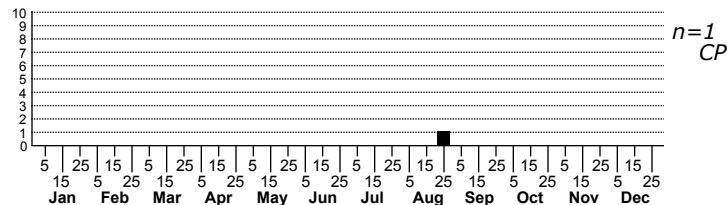
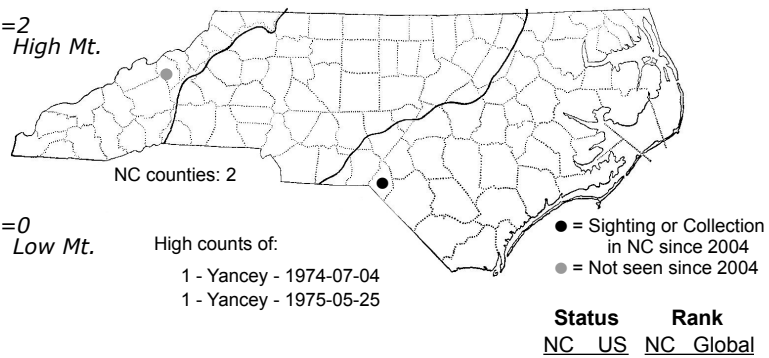
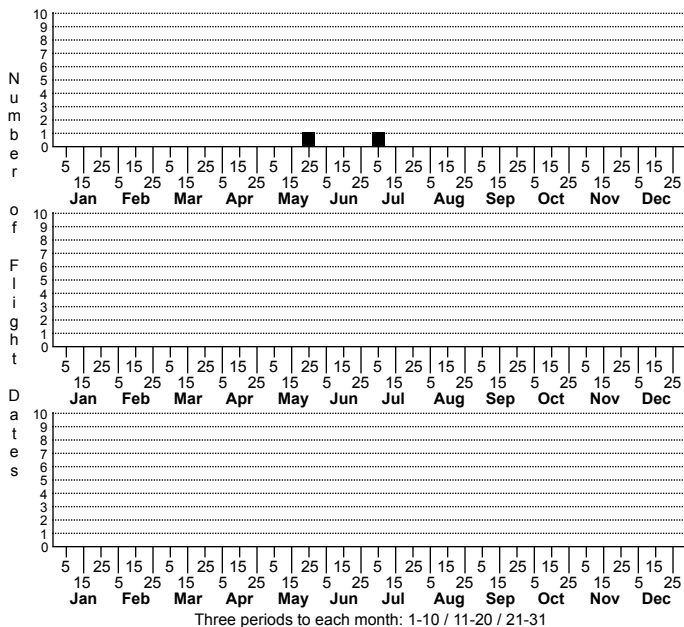

HABITAT: Our two records for this species come from Spruce-fir Forests, where the species is more likely to be a rare stray rather than a resident

FOOD: Larvae have recorded on *Asemeia* (=Polygala) *grandiflora*, which is rare in North Carolina and restricted to the Sandhills region
