

HABITAT: Our records come mainly from riparian habitats but also from upland forests, particularly in the mountains.

FOOD: Larvae have been found on apple (<i>Malus</i>) and hawthorn (<i>Crataegus</i>) but may feed on other members of the Rosaceae (Wagner et al., 2011). We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
