

HABITAT: Our records from the Coastal Plain come almost entirely from wet forests where <i>Aronia</i> and several species of hawthorns are common. Some of the records from the Piedmont and Mountains also come from low-lying areas but the majority are from upland areas.

FOOD: Larvae may be stenophagous on members of the Rosaceae. Wagner et al. (2011) report finding them on Choke Cherry (<i>Prunus virginiana</i>) and hawthorn (<i>Crataegus</i>), and also reared them on Serviceberry (<i>Amelanchier</i>). Beadle and Leckie (2012) also list chokeberry (<i>Aronia</i>) and apple. We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
