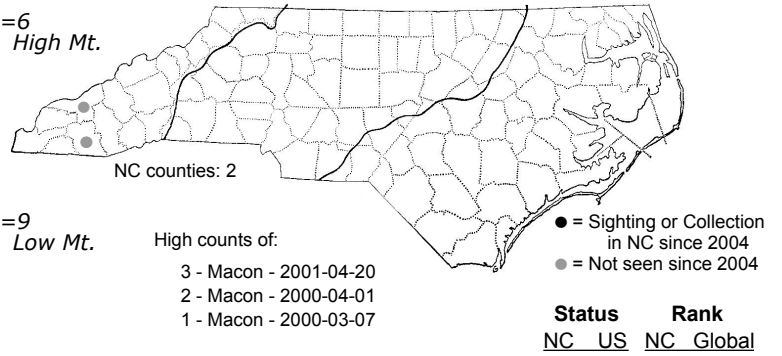
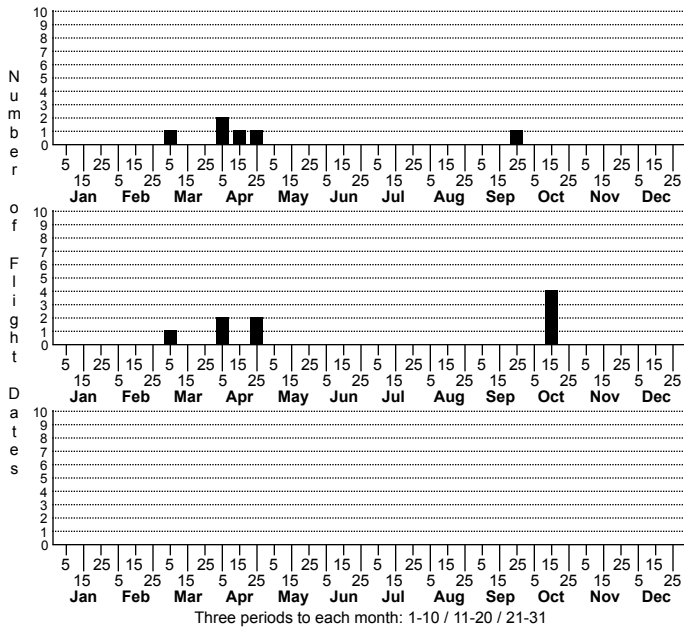


Lithophane semiusta No common name
