
Lithophane disposita Dashed Gray Pinion

FOOD: Larvae feed mainly on willow (<i>Salix</i>) and poplars (<i>Populus</i>, especially aspen); also on birch (<i>Betula</i>) and elm (<i>Ulmus</i>), and probably others (Wagner et al., 2011). We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
