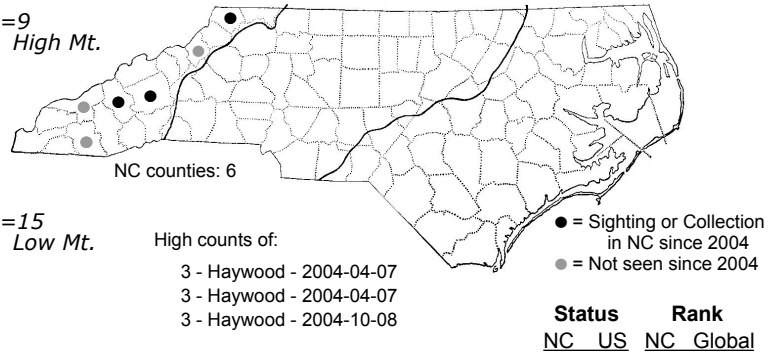
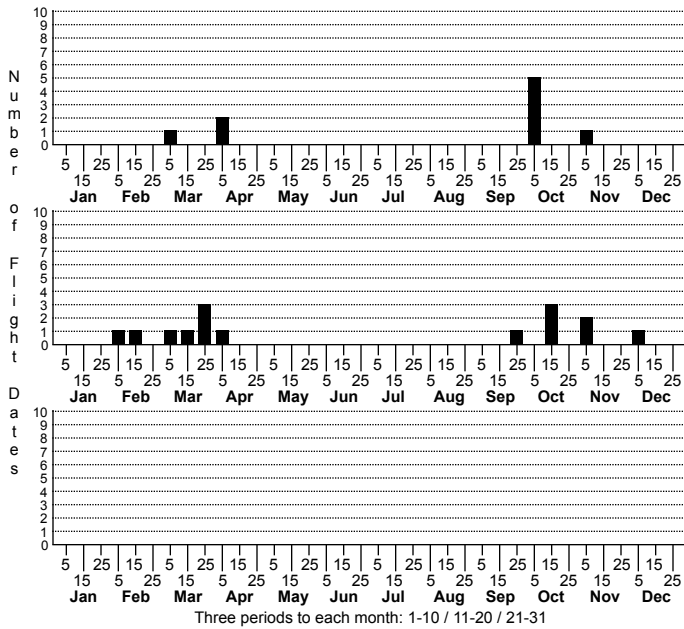


*Lithophane baileyi* Bailey's Pinion
