
Lithophane querquera Shivering Pinion

HABITAT: Our records come mainly from cove forests in the Mountains but with a number of records from wet hardwood forests in the northern Coastal Plain

FOOD: Larvae are polyphagous on many species of hardwood trees and shrubs. Wagner et al. (2011) specifically list ash (<i>Fraxinus</i>), apple (<i>Malus</i>), American Hop-hornbeam (<i>Ostrya virginiana</i>), cherry (<i>Prunus</i>), and oak (<i>Quercus</i>).
