




Lithophane tepida White-eyed Pinion

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae are polyphagous on a wide range of shrubs and trees. Wagner et al. (2011) specifically list birch (*Betula*), Sweet-fern (*Comptonia peregrina*), spruce (*Picea*), oak (*Quercus*), currant (*Ribes*), basswood (*Tilia*), and blueberry (*Vaccinium*).
