
Lithophane laticinerea Broad Ashen Pinion

HABITAT: Our two records come from wet forests, one from a montane riparian forest and one from a non-riverine swamp forest in the Coastal Plain

FOOD: Larvae feed primarily on maples, including Red Maple (<i>Acer rubrum</i>) and Silver Maple (<i>A. saccharinum</i>); other confirmed records come from American Basswood (<i>Tilia americana</i>), crabapple (<i>Malus</i>), and Black Oak (<i>Quercus velutina</i>) (Wagner et al., 2011).
