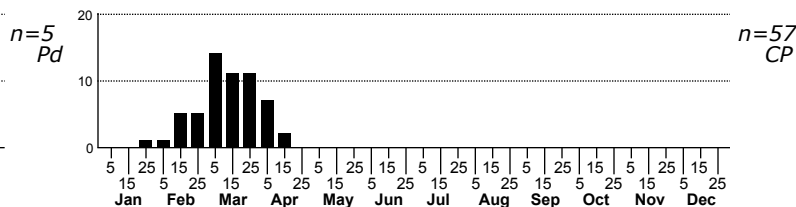
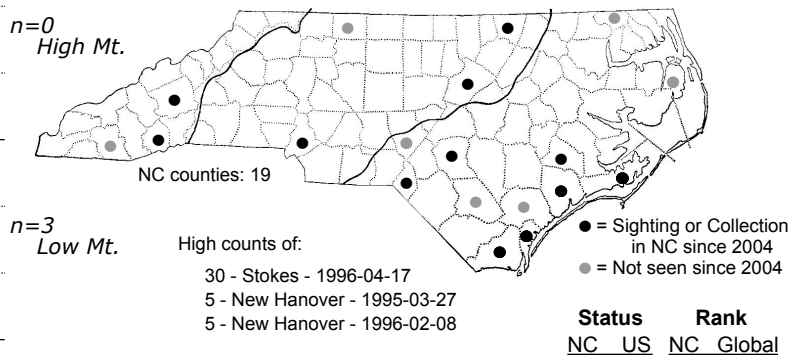
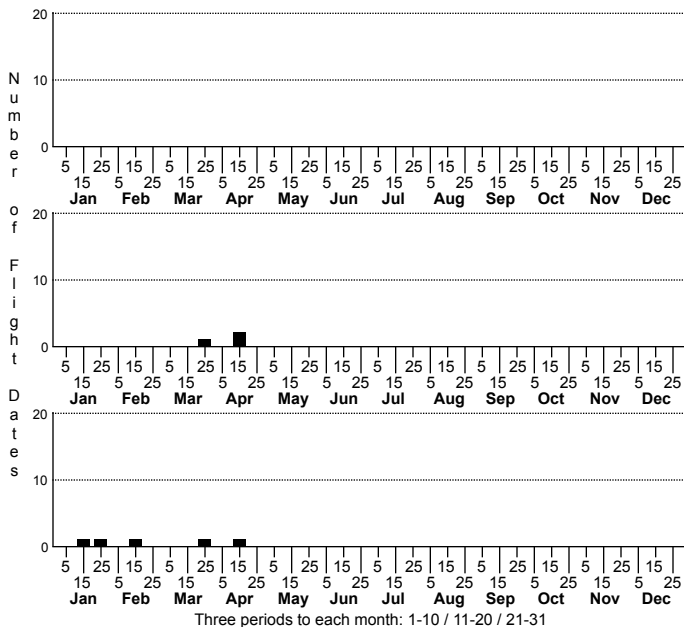

HABITAT: Wagner et al. (2011) list woodlands, forests, and barrens as habitats used by this species. Our records come from a variety of dry, open woodlands and barrens, including maritime scrub, pine-oak heath habitats, dry ridges, and open lakeshores.

FOOD: Larval host plants include heaths and oaks, as well as other hardwood trees and shrubs (Wagner et al., 2011).
