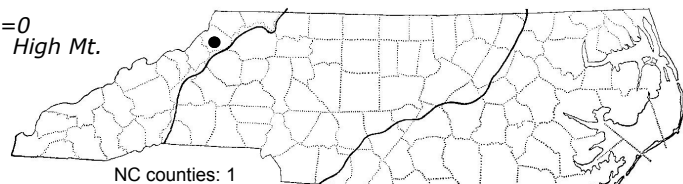
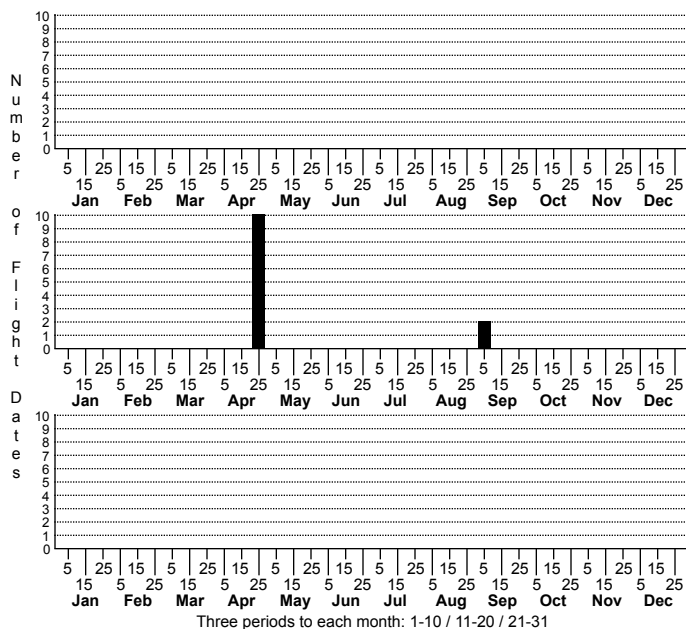

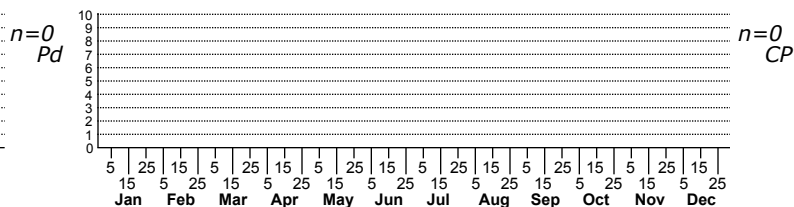

DISTRIBUTION: This species appears to be endemic to North Carolina and is nearly confined to Watauga County (Shelley and Whitehead, 1986)

HABITAT: Shelley and Whitehead describe this species as primarily a cove-inhabitant but that also occurs away from stream valleys and is often found in the residential areas of Blowing Rock and Boone
