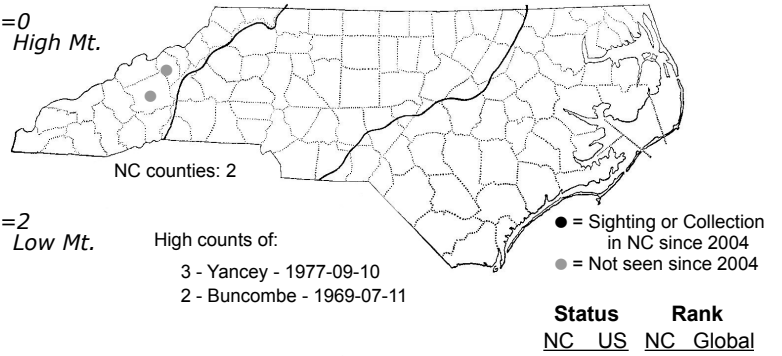
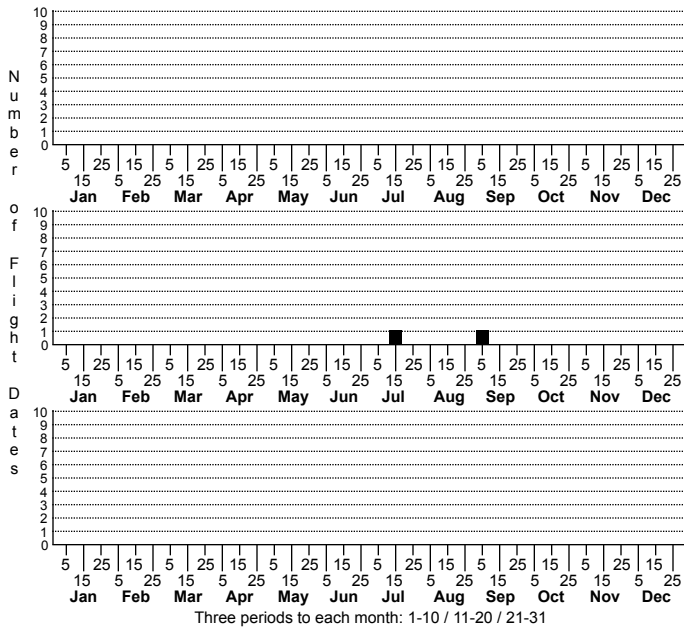

DISTRIBUTION: The range of this subspecies is surrounded by that of *S. n. intermedia* (Shelley, 1981). It is located to the west and north of the Black Mountains and includes at least a portion of the Craggy Mountains.

HABITAT: Shelley (1981) does not characterize the habitat used by this subspecies but notes that it occupies the headwaters of two drainages on either side of a divide. Very likely, this subspecies can be regarded as a cove-inhabitant, similar to the description given to the other members of this species
